Educational exposure tour of CCI students from Sikkim to Kolkata

Under the initiative of the Women and Child Development Department, Government of Sikkim, 66 students from 12 Child Care Institutions across Sikkim and 5 escort teachers, as tour-incharge, visited the 'City of Joy' in West Bengal.

On 23rd of April, the group started their bus journey towards NJP, Siliguri.

DAY ONE OF THE TOUR (23.04.2024)

The first day started with a train journey from NJP to Howrah station.

After their arrival at howrah, the students were taken for a local sight seeing within the city and were taken back to their hotel.

The day finished with a short interactive session and dinner at the hotel.

DAY TWO OF THE TOUR (24.04.2024)

On the second day, after morning breakfast, attendance and brief meeting, the group visited the SCI-ENCE CITY which is one of the largest science centres in the Indian subcontinent, presenting science and technology in a stimulating and engaging environment that was truly educational and enjoyable for the students.

In the evening the students enjoyed the Taramandal show of the BIRLA PLANETORIUM.

DAY THREE OF THE TOUR 25.04.2024)

The third day started with the group visiting the INDIAN MUSEUM.

The students were then taken to one of the oldest church in the city- St. Cathedral Church. Post lunch, they visited VICTORIA MEMORIAL where they had a full-fledged tour of the memorial's garden and museum.

In the evening, the students were taken to the JAMES PRINCEP GHAT.

DAY FOUR OF THE TOUR (26.04.2024)

On the fourth day, the students visited the famous ALIPORE ZOO. The studebts were excited to see the wild animals, reptiles and various species of birds. They walked past each and every cage to observe the different animals in action. The visit to the zoo was an enriching experience for the students. The same day, the students visited THE NATIONAL LIBRARY, KOLKATA. A guide was arranged for the students to explore the library. In the evening, the students visited DAKSHINESWAR KALI TEMPLE. A ferry ride from dakshineswar to BELUR MATH was arranged for the group. At the math, the students were given a brief history and different activities carried out by the Math. The group through their visit to different spaces of the Math spent a peaceful evening.

DAY FIVE OF THE TOUR (27.04.2024)

On the fifth day, the group visited NICCO PARK, an amusement park. The park has numerous rides and shows which are not just recreational but educational as well.

Water rides were the star attraction of the day. From there the group proceeded to New Market, one of the shopping destinations in the city, for lunch and shopping. After the five days of stay in the city, the group then headed back to Siliguri from Howrah via an early morning train journey on the **28th** of **April.**

After reaching Sikkim the very same day, all the students were then safely handed over to their respective centres. This tour has provided the students with an opportunity to have first-hand exposure to different city cultures, historical sites and generate an exchange of experience, discipline and good practice between themselves.

Daily diary writing was made mandatory for the students to capture their daily experience. It has enabled them to have a better understanding of themselves and to interact with and learn from each other as well.
